Dear Compassionate Friends and Supporters of BFT Locally and Around the Globe,

The struggles throughout 2021 all of us have dealt with COVID have been a major challenge for us here at BFT, the people of Cambodia and our friends everywhere. I truly hope that you have all made it through the year safely and in good health.

Despite the hardship COVID has brought on us, I am delighted to be able to report on the successes the team at BFT have had through the past year. While much effort has gone into supporting villagers who have seen additional hardship from COVID, we have been proud of the work done to continue supporting schools and allowing village children to attend free of hunger. Local and international donations have allowed us to provide support for emergency food relief and hygiene supplies for the poorest of our villagers.



Through the generous support of Bob and Indu Shah and our friends at P.O.E.M. in France, we have built more classrooms and other facilities at secondary schools in villages. Other donors have made it possible to improve food security through programs to create more school and home gardens, including the planting of thousands of fruit trees provided through the Trees of Love initiative. Income generation has improved through training and supporting villagers to raise chickens and other livestock and creating sewing businesses.

With last year's funding from a Rotary Grant and ongoing support from other friends, we have greatly increased year-round access to clean water and WASH education for many villagers and continue to work to improve this further.

To build better skills for the future, we have continued supporting training and higher education for some BFT team members and community youth as well as providing English language and computer skills to local children at our Learning Centre in Siem Reap. This has included helping improve football skills through our association with our partner at HFCA.

Please continue to be safe in 2022 and may the New Year bring all people Happiness, Health, Prosperity and Peace! We look forward to welcoming you back to Cambodia soon!

## 2nd Project for secondary schools funded by Bob & Indu Shah together with Polio Children in Need Charity in the UK

#### - Secondary school building

Another place of exciting news, we were so happy to receive funds to build more classrooms use for the secondary school in Prey Chhkar Village, Pong Ro Lue Commune, and Chi Kreang District. In the past few years, many



children finished their primary school and they could not afford to go to the secondary school as it is located too far from their villages.



These days, the four new classrooms will make a big difference to all primary graduate students who live in the village and surrounding areas for their studies and we believe that in the future, we will have more educated people in these areas helping develop their communities.



#### - Teacher accommodation

A building of 2 room for teachers' accommodation also funded by Bob & Indu Shah and Polio Children in Need Charity in UK. This facility will help teachers to stay, have more times on teaching and planning where in the past they spent so many hours travelling back and forth from their village.



#### - Toilets blocks

We also received funding to build 3 toilet blocks, this facility will help to provide a service as well as improve sanitation in this school.

# Project Singha Sponsored by FoBFT Hong Kong

The nutritious food feeding provided 6 days a week to 70 children every morning before they start their lessons. Besides the feeding program, the Singha school teacher also did great work on the school demonstration garden.



They grow different kinds of vegetables and all of these veggies are used for their daily breakfast program.



# Emergency food, hygiene and school supplies supported by local and International partners and supporters

Many poor villages and schools in Siem Reap and Banteay Meanchey have received emergency food and hygiene supplies donated by our local and international partners.

## - Emergency food supplies

The food supplies were mainly distributed to disadvantaged families who suffered during the lockdown and the community outbreaks.





#### - Hygiene supplies

Many of the schools in remote rural areas do not have hygiene supplies to use for prevention of Covid-19 spreading in their community but through the donations and funds raised from both local and international doners, we have managed to provide hygiene supplies such as face masks, hand sanitizers, hundred of liters of alcohol hand sanitizers, and thousands of bars of soap to primary and secondary schools along with education on how to practice safety procedures to prevent the possible spread of the COVID19 Virus.



Furthermore, some funds we raised locally with the help of our volunteers and friends enabled us to buy some school stationery for children.

Yothin and his local volunteer team will help take the lead to build more awareness, connection and fund raising in and out Cambodia for the future sustainability of BFT.




# School Uniforms Donated by Roni Sivan

## **Financials and Recognition**



With an income of \$212.310,97, and expenditures of \$219.792,64, we had a slight deficit for the year. The overall income was, however, significantly lower than the previous year and, while we are able to deliver services to support villagers, expanding to new villages will requires additional donations; something many of our supporters are actively working to secure.

It should be noted that, while the graph shows that 6.61% of expenditure was on Administration and fundraising, a significant portion of this was for costs of project work in the villages that is general in nature and difficult to allocate.

"Expenses for the 2021 financial year exceeded income by (\$7.481,67). This resulted in a reduction of the surplus carried forwarded from \$11.096,15 at the end of the 2020 year to \$3.656,20 at the end if 2021





