Dear Friends and Supporters of BFT Locally and Around the Globe,

Like everyone else in the world, BFT continued to struggle with the effects of COVID in 2022, with related reduction in funding made worse by sharp cost increases brought on by the Russian invasion of Ukraine. I hope you have all stayed safe and healthy throughout the year.

I am delighted to be able to tell you of the many accomplishments of the BFT team and the generous supporters who have made it happen.

Through the generous support of Bob and Indu Shah with Polio Children in Need (UK), our friends at P.O.E.M. in France and Friends of BFT Hong Kong, we have built another high school, additional rooms classrooms and facilities at other schools in remote villages. Other donors, including Om-Health (Singapore), Lions Club (Singapore), Trees of Love (UK) and others have provided food and improved food security through programs to develop farming skills and create more school and home gardens, including the establishment of a duck cooperative funded by Gillian and Benn Gray.



Critical to improving the lives of villages is ensuring they have access to year-round supplies of clean water. With additional funding from Rotary International, 5 Rotary Clubs, Bob and Indu Shah, Lions Club of Singapore, Friends of Belgium and ongoing support from other friends, we have been able to successfully drill many deep wells and install equipment in several villages. Clean water is essential to good health and also adds to food security with the ability to irrigate gardens.

With support from friends in Germany, Belgium, Hong Kong, SE Asia Foundation, Tawingo Funds, Dr. Mattie Muldoon and others, we have been able to provide skill development, education and peace building in villages, the BFT Learning Center in Siem Reap and for the BFT team. Building better skills for the future will allow Cambodians to become more self-sufficient and improve our team's ability to provide the best possible support. Support for skills development has included extending our association with our partner at HFCA to improve football skills for children in some of the villages BFT supports.

I want to make special mention of and congratulate the team here at BFT. They have worked tirelessly throughout the year in very difficult circumstances to better the lives of poor Cambodians. Thank you to Gillian and Michael Cappelletto and Sue Ferguson for their ongoing support in funding wages for team members. I'd also like to thank Friends of BFT HK for sponsoring one of our teachers at university, to Sharon and Pete, friends in Australia for sponsoring one school teacher from Sre Robong at university and Katrina and John Hayward for sponsoring Nursing studies for one of our young women who has now successfully completed her second year. The first high school building project in Dang Rek and clean water funded by The Bob & Indu Shah Family Foundation along with Polio Children in Need Charity in UK

Bob and Indu Shah together with Polio Children in Need Charity in UK have been working very effectively in supporting in the area of education development particular in school building projects for the rural villages of Siem Reap and Banteay Meanchey Provinces.



Since 2019 Bob and Indu Shah and Polio Children in Need Charity in UK had sponsored the buildings with 6 classrooms, toilet blocks & teachers' house for Prey Chka, Oroong and surrounding villages to establish their first new secondary schools in their areas.



Early 2022 Bob and Indu Shah the Polio Children in Need Charity in UK funded another new building of High school in Dang Rek in Banteay Meanchey Province to enable older students continue higher education once they completed the secondary school level in this area. This high school building of 6 classrooms project is almost coming to an end, the building is expected to finished early January 2023.

Moreover, Bob and Indu Shah together with Polio Children in Need in UK also funded the clean water system and water wells for whole communities in the remote rural areas of Siem Reap and Banteay Meanchey to have access to all year-round water supply with safe and clean for their communities. The building of teachers' office & library, kitchen with dining room and toilets projects funded by POEM Foundation from France

Duck cooperative farms by the Grey Family and FoBFT Australia

A total of 800 ducklings have been delivered to Kromom Bol and La'ak villages, each duck cooperative receiving 300 ducklings to raise with the remaining 200 ducklings being delivered to 20 families, who all received 10 ducklings each – ten families in La'ak and ten families in Kromom Bol.



Three days livestock training on the skills involved with duck-raising was conducted in La'ak in the middle of April and was provided to 25 families by the Agriculture District Officers and coordinated by the BFT Project Leader.

As a result, 50 families received duckraising training education, 20 families received ducklings, and 2 families select to manage the duck cooperative places in La'ak and Kromom Bol.





Learning Center, Peace Building, Family Adoption Support and Nutrition funded by Friends of BFT Germany

English and Computer Program

Our English and Computer programs have continued to operate as normal with larger groups of children at BFT. There are 150 students attending the evening classes from 5pm to 7pm at the evening through Monday—Friday. Around 50 computers learners attending the computer classes different hours from the morning to the evening.







Family Adoption Support

With the funding we received from FoBFT Germany we managed to provide adoption support to help some families in Sre Robong and in Kromom Bol. These families were trained on proper animal and

agricultural techniques and were then provided with some seed money to start their businesses at their own houses. Moreover, ten children and adults receive daily meals, study time and living support thanks to the help of FoBFT Germany.



Peace Building

Aim and Ven. Veasna have been working to provide consoling support to 20 families from three villages in the districts of Svay Lue and Chi Kreang. The follow up visits have been carried out by the peace building team.



Child Support

Ten children and adults at the Learning Center are provided daily meals three times a day. A big thank you to our donors in Germany for their continued support in providing these children's education, family adoption, and community life skills training.

The second projects of Rotary Global Grant by five Rotary Clubs and the Bob & Indu Shah Family Foundation & Polio children in UK

Today the Rotary Global Grant 2232355 – Cambodian Villages Water Project had come to an end of the project there are many hundreds of families from 5 different villages have provided reliable year-round water supplies from the total of 50 bore wells along with Community WASH Promotion Education to everyone in these villages.



The WASH evaluators, Mr. Sedtha, Manith and Aim led by the project manager, Oddom and Sina to the Global Grant Villages for their final inspection and evaluation particularly on WASH practice behaviors of the villagers after they attended the workshop in the past. According to Mr. Sedtha and his team, they were very happy to see the good results, a lot of villagers change their behaviour better, the villages clean and lot of people learnt and practice and change their behavior.



The 3rd Rotary Global Grant Project Plan and preparation of washroom in Tapour Village

We would like to let you know that our friends and supporters at Friends of BFT Australia and USA have been working closely with the Rotary Club of Chadstone East Malvern and the Rotary World of Difference foundation on another major project - this time for the installation of community washrooms to provide improved hygiene, reduced water contamination, and also safety and privacy, especially for young women.



We are currently working with our friends in Rotary on a submission to the Rotary Foundation for a third major Global Grant. This will combine Rotary funding with that raised from our supporters to provide washrooms and greatly improve the quality of life for the village of Tapour in Svey Leu district, in the northeast of Siem Reap province.



Not only will the project provide these much -needed facilities, it will also establish a team from this village who will be trained in the required construction techniques. After completion of this project, this team will work on subsequent washroom projects in nearby villages.

Threds of Red from USA & UK

Our group of volunteers from Threds of Red from UK and USA together with our team have conducted health education on menstrual health and hygiene education to older girls and boys in school, educating adults and parents about sexual health, sexually-transmitted diseases and family planning in our remote rural villages.



Over six days in six villages, 107 boys attended male-focused health education, 276 children attended health, hygiene and puberty education, 506 younger children attended hygiene and hand washing instruction, 76 adult women and 72 adult men attended sexual health education, and we provided 289 pairs of reading glasses, 120 pairs of sunglasses and 250 toothbrushes to the six villages.



We would like to extend our deepest appreciation and gratitude for all their commitment and contributions with loving care and sympathy to make a huge difference to the life of the impoverished villagers - especially the children we supported. We truly value their important mission and wish them a safe and joyful return home to the USA and UK. We are already missing them and look forward to welcoming all of them again in the future.

The Siem Reap-based BFT was established in 2006 by Long Sedtha, and manages programmes designed to help impoverished children (including orphans) within the local communities there and in other provinces.

As the Trees of Love project matures, it's really rewarding to see sponsors from all over the world buying fruit tree saplings to plant, and over 200 have been planted so far! Some are celebrations of life, some are eco-gifts, and some (movingly) are bought as memory or memorial trees.



The saplings are planted in a number of villages in the poorest parts of Cambodia, the locations often being schools BFT is working with.



These little saplings also have long term benefits. As they grow, they'll enable the communities to be more self-sufficient, giving them fruit to eat (and surplus to sell) and the wood to build shelters and furniture. The branches of these trees provide shade, and the leaves will eventually fall and put nutrients back into the soil. These really are Trees of Love.






For the 2022 financial year, the total amount of our income (donations) was \$297,373. Our total expenditure for project and operations was \$295,297.

In addition, we a further amount of \$82,500 (not included in the revenue and expense graph figures) for Rotary Global Grant projects being run by BFT where the funds are paid directly from Rotary to subcontractors rather than coming through BFT's own accounts.

In any case, the overall income was significantly higher than the previous year allowing us to expand delivery of projects and services to support the needs of villagers. This was made possible by our generous donors and supporters who have actively worked with us to secure the project operation scheme.

It should be noted that, only some 5 % of expenditure was in the areas of administration and fundraising, with the remaining 95% being committed to the delivery of projects and services in the villages.
